


# Electricity policy senegal



## Overview

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Senegal has launched the National Energy Pact to achieve universal electricity access by 2030. With a national electricity access rate of 84%, Senegal is making progress towards universal energy access, yet more than 30 % of rural communities remain disconnected from the grid. As part of the Just Energy Transition Partnership, Senegal has committed to bold reforms to increase renewable. The political agenda of the current president, Bassirou Diomaye Diakhary Faye, includes a simultaneous focus on fossil fuels, with the renegotiation of oil contracts with major energy companies, and an increase in Senegalese renewable energy development. 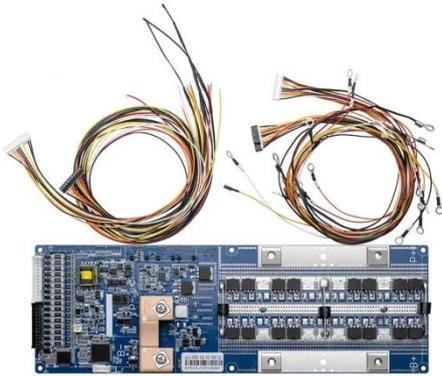
