

# Juba Bridge uses 20-foot folding shipping containers



## Overview

---

It was built in 1972 during the regime of General Gaafar Nimeiry, from two World War II era bridges and it cost \$2. It was re-opened in January 2012 after major repair works following an accident in 2010 which left one lane of the bridge unusable for heavy. The Juba Nile Bridge is composed of two adjacent 252 meter spans over the White Nile in Juba, South Sudan, on the Juba-Nimule Road, and until 2022 provided the only access over the River Nile to South Sudan. Constructed in 1974 by the Dutch construction company. In the heart of Juba, the capital city of South Sudan, stands one of the oldest structures that has become an integral part of the nation's history, the Juba Nile Bridge. The Project for Construction of Nile River Bridge in Juba, South Sudan, was initiated in 2012. The bridge opening ceremony was held on and JICA President TANAKA. South Sudan, which gained independence from Sudan in July 2011 after many years of conflict, faces a serious lack of social and economic infrastructure.



## Juba Nile Bridge

The original Nile bridge crossing at Juba was built in 1974 by the Dutch construction company De Groot International under a United Nations programme. The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees paid about one million dollar. The total cost of the bridge was 2.5 million. The Dutch government put up the remaining 1.5 million. On 15 March 1974 it was opened by general Gaafar Nimeiry. Up until that time an irregular ferry service was the only way to cross the Nile river for hundreds of miles. After the Suda...
