Overview

Portugal has a liberalized electricity market, which means you can choose (and change) your electricity supplier (“comercializador”), while the physical network is operated by the distribution company (“distribuidor”), mainly E-REDES. If you want a quick rule of thumb: your energy bill is driven by three levers: (1) your tariff and supplier (regulated vs liberalized, fixed vs indexed, single-rate vs time-of-use), (2) your “potência contratada” and usage patterns (when you run heating, hot water, laundry), and (3) your home's.
